

A Change in the Air Story Bible

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Story Premise –

As the crowded streets of Manhattan celebrate a new year into 2024, Dillan, a high schooler in hopes of soon helping to enforce the law, makes an eerie discovery in the outskirts of the city. Animals have become rampant, and humans lose sight of control. Explosions and blood-curling screams flow through the air.

A virus that controls the mind of living organisms plagues the once vibrant city. With his father missing, Dillan, along with his family and other survivors, must develop and utilize keen survival skills to escape a violent, grotesque nightmare.

Historical Background Information or Timeline –

Prior to the inciting incident in New York City, which occurs in 2024, key events have taken place, which all help contribute to the story and the plot.

New York City's ongoing sound cycle of beeps, chatter, and various animals fills the air, which earns it its well-popular title, "The City That Never Sleeps." Its five boroughs—Queens, Brooklyn, The Bronx, Staten Island, and Manhattan—contain buildings, shops, and areas that offer businesses, wonder, and innovation, and it shows no signs of ceasing the work and play of its multiethnic population. From places to eat, hotels, parks, and museums, the city has much to offer to its inhabitants and more.

The Statue of Liberty stands tall and its structure allows for citizens of New York and travelers to climb steps inside the lady figure and reach the crown area, where pictures can be taken of the city from a high area.

The 'I Love New York' symbol has been used in New York since 1977 by graphic designer, Milton Glaser. This specific graphic has been typed out by an American Typewriter in rounded slab serif typeface and follows with a depiction of a red heart. Its popular existence processes over \$30 million a year through various merchandise like mugs and t-shirts and are still found all over New York to this day.

The Brooklyn Bridge stretches over the New York City East River for a lengthy 1,600 feet, and it links two of the city's boroughs, Manhattan and Brooklyn.

An abandoned subway has been built beneath Broadway and Warren Street in Manhattan back in 1870. While the tubes have been sealed up and then some reused for the construction of the Brooklyn Rapid Transit, this information details the history of subways beneath NYC—specifically, an abandoned one that has never been exposed to the public. Since the story takes place in the future, the rest of the abandoned tubes have been used as access to an artificial underground experimental facility, which the corrupt organization behind the virus outbreak has developed.

Main Character(s)

Protagonist: Dillan

Dillan is an analytical 16-year-old high schooler, who lives in Bronxville, New York with his sister, Irene, and his parents, Dr. Jericho and Isabelle. He has a fascination for criminal justice and law enforcement; however, he fears real-life violence. Being diagnosed with Schizophrenia at the age of 13, he suffers from anxiety attacks, which affects certain activities in his daily life. Regardless of his health condition, he is still eager to receive a position in the New York Police Department in the next few years and have a chance to don a police badge and uniform. He has a strong understanding of knowing what is right and what is wrong—especially in society. While he tends to avoid violent confrontations with people and suffers from panic and delusional episodes, he does have a keen sense of knowledge in various subjects, such as analytical assessments, reconnaissance, the lawful system, and the geography of New York City, and he hopes to one day make the world a safer place with lesser criminals and by re-establishing the law.

Antagonist: Dr. Jericho

With this mindset, he joins a corrupt and deranged military organization called “Shade,” which prioritizes him, his knowledge, and his newfound research, with a focus to eliminate all humans and animals. As the new captain of Shade, he sets off to revolutionize the existence of mankind as means for revenge by beginning his attack on his home state, New York City, and using the JER-0 virus to achieve his plan.

Locations –

1. Dillan, Dr. Jericho, Isabelle, Irene, and Choco's House in Bronxville, New York

The story starts off at Dillan's family home in Bronxville, New York. The picture below is a perfect representation of what the house would look like. While the story will not provide further details about the neighborhood of Bronxville, the house is a key component where not only character introductions take place, but also the inciting incident. Viewers will get a clear visualization of the house's interior and exterior, as Dillan, Irene, Isabelle, Dr. Jericho, and Choco wander about and do their favorite activities. This is where we get character introductions for the main characters, as well as the majority of supporting characters. The beginning of the story may take some time to conclude, as the inciting incident boils up starting from the very beginning.

Important rooms like Dr. Jericho's office, Dillan's bedroom, Dr. Jericho's bedroom, the kitchen, and the front yard are all significant to the plot of the story. Dr. Jericho's office contains files that link to the virus he has been developing, which Dillan discovers. Dillan's bedroom is where the inciting incident first reaches the audience's viewing experience, which is a gunshot from outside his window. Dr. Jericho's bedroom creates one of the story's burning mysteries, which is when Dillan discovers that his father still hasn't arrived from work after being missing for over a day. At last, the kitchen is where Dillan and his family fall into the inciting incident as an infected human stumbles inside their home and tries to kill them. The front yard is where Dillan and his family finally escape from their house and venture into the unknown, where a horde of infected live.

2. Statue of Liberty

In the middle of the story, after Dillan and his family make it to the city, encounter various infected people and animals, and confront friendly and hostile survivors, they come to an understanding that there is a cure recipe for the JER-0 virus that has been hidden deep within the city. After apprehending one of Dr. Jericho's soldiers, they discover that this key research rests in the crown of the Statue of Liberty.

This location is another important aspect of the story because it makes the plot progress much further as tension and reveals arise. This piece of architecture symbolizes freedom, but its isolation and tall structure make it difficult for the protagonists to stop the virus from spreading. This scene also delivers the end of Choco as he is overrun by infected. This ends up adding more to the challenge when Dillan and the rest of his family have to return to the bottom of the statue as Choco himself becomes infected and

tries to kill them. The loss of Choco is also what helps Dillan overcome his fear of fighting back with violence, as he has no choice but to shoot an infected after his mother gets attacked by it.

After obtaining the recipe, the characters themselves and the audience discover that Dr. Jericho is the one responsible for creating and distributing the virus along with the corrupt government. This also brings them to their next and final challenge, which is searching for the laboratory that has the correct equipment for analyzing and processing Dr. Jericho's research.

3. Underground Experimental Laboratory

The intense conclusion of the story, the climax and the resolution, start at this location. After discovering and traveling through an abandoned subway beneath Broadway and Warren Street in Manhattan, Dillan and his family arrive at an underground laboratory that has equipment primarily for experimental uses. The image below is a great representation of what a portion of the laboratory would like. Since this story takes place five years into the future—2024—I have decided to include this hidden laboratory because it corresponds to the plot. It is where Dr. Jericho has been developing his research on the JER-0 virus for a whole year with the Shade organization.

The laboratory isn't overly huge—it only consists of one large room and a small room. The large room is where previous and present experiments are conducted. Examination tables, lab equipment, bright lighting, biohazard suits, cabinets of various chemicals, and other laboratory equipment litter the entire, expansive area. What also makes this location particularly special is that Dr. Jericho has been hiding here most of the time and has been developing newer experiments with the JER-0 virus. This is where Dillan, his family, and other survivors also must comprehend Dr. Jericho and members from the Shade military in order to put an end to the spread of the virus.

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Additional World Information:

Geopolitics:

*This particular section mainly focuses on micro-geopolitics and are only relevant after the inciting incident of the story.

- 1. Surviving Citizens v. Hostile Survivors** As a deadly virus, the JER-0 virus, spreads across the boroughs of New York City and beyond, a large quantity of the city's population has become vicious from the incurable symptoms. The city slowly becomes a wasteland as people die from the virus, starvation, and accidents—thus, food and supplies become scarce and are difficult to find. That's where greedy and aggressive survivors of the virus arrive, as they search vigorously for any resources they plan to use only for themselves. These are a significant group of people that are a part of the surviving citizens of New York City, where the other half are those who aren't hostile towards others during survival. This leads to the micro-geopolitics, where more innocent survivors of the virus have to face against other, more aggressive, survivors. These hostile survivors use the weapons and other materials they've collected and stole to annihilate other survivors.
- 2. Surviving Citizens v. Viruses** While there are two parts of the surviving citizens of New York City, there are those who have been affected with the JER-0 virus and have no chances of returning to normal. The virus itself, which is a part of the medicine category, has intentions of removing normal functions in human and animal brains and replacing them with more uncontrollable, unpredictable thought processes. This virus itself may not be a person, but it is a thing, a chemically-engineered parasite that is designed by the Shade organization to destroy mankind. While the living beings who have been affected by this virus can be considered part of this category, it is mainly the virus itself that the survivors of New York City have to go up against throughout the story. The virus implants dangerous actions into the host, which are to seek out survivors and feast on their organs.
- 3. Surviving Citizens v. Corrupt Government** This category is also part of the micro-geopolitics as the protagonists of the story have to face more than just hostile survivors and the virus, but the government behind them both. The Shade is a corrupt military organization that has hired Dr. Jericho to destroy mankind for power and finances. Besides Dr. Jericho, its captain, the organization is made up of soldiers that have military training and equipment. With the Shade's blasphemous greed and power and Dr. Jericho's unpredictable and rageful plans, the survivors must face against three dangers that this world has to face.

Technology:

1. **JER-0 Virus Helmet** These military goggles have been enhanced with newer technology that allows wearers to see viruses nearby—particularly, the JER-0 virus. This is possible due to thermal upgrades within the lens of the helmet. These are mostly worn by the Shade organization throughout the story; however, there is one instance where Dillan gains access to this helmet to help guide his family and other survivors safely to the abandoned subway in Manhattan.
2. **JER-0 Virus Drones** This piece of equipment has been altered by the Shade organization, which allows automatic drones to dispense the JER-0 virus through a spraying mechanism. These deadly machines can hover over the air and hold up to over 2.1 gallons of the infectious virus, which can cause great damage to the population within New York City.

Medicine:

1. **Viruses** The virus itself, the JER-0 virus, has been heavily engineered by Dr. Jericho, a scientist and soldier full of enagement and vengeance. This virus has been chemically-engineered to include parasites that attack brain function and destroy it completely. After that process has finished, the virus replaces the original brain function with its own chemically-engineered process and enables the host to act in unpredictable and ferocious ways, such as biting, pounding, tackling, ripping, pulling, and slamming other living beings after seeking them out. This degenerating virus has no way to be ceased, unless, if in contact with a cure, which has been researched successfully by Dr. Jericho, also.

Those who have been affected with the virus can be avoided completely or killed, which means destroying the host's brain. Either way, this cannot officially destroy the virus.

2. **Cures for Viruses** The cure for the JER-0 virus has been completely researched by Dr. Jericho, however, its existence has been halted by the Shade organization. The cure is the key to officially killing the virus, and the only way to use it efficiently is to spread it across the city with the JER-0 Virus Drones, as well as handing it over to the US Army scientists for full vaccination support. The cure has been chemically-engineered the same way as the virus—the only difference is the missing component of the parasite, which deliver the negative effects to brains of living beings. The cure has protein elements, which fights the parasitic infection, and it can only exist by experimenting on someone who has already been infected with the virus to draw out those elements.

Story Synopsis –

Dillan, an analytical high schooler with Schizophrenia, survives an attack with a virus-infected human being in his own home. Dillan, his mother, Isabelle, his sister, Irene, and the family dog, Choco, flee their house, running past a plethora of screaming and fleeing in different directions, where they get in the car to drive out to the city.

Upon arrival, Dillan and his family drive through the streets of Manhattan, when suddenly, they've been attacked by more infected. The car crashes, and Dillan and his family travel on foot. As an infected attacks, Dillan has a panic episode. Isabelle fends off the creature as Irene helps Dillan recover. Ty. Dillan and his family settle the situation before Ty shoots the thieves. He joins their group to search for the whereabouts of a cure.

They make their way to the Statue of Liberty's crown, Ty goes missing, and Choco gets infected. As Irene goes into panic, an infected attacks her, and she drops a gun. Dillan shoots the infected, and they make their way out with the cure recipe and a map to the laboratory.

They go through an abandoned subway beneath Manhattan to reach the experiment facility, where Jericho, Dillan's father, conducts the virus experiments. Jericho tries to please his family with his work, but they're disgusted, making Jericho inject himself angrily with the virus. Dillan and his family put up a struggle as Isabelle gets infected. Jericho finally falls after a bloody fight.

With minutes to spare, Isabelle persuades her son to retrieve the cure before it's too late. She passes away on the operating table, but with a cure in Dillan, Irene, and Ty's hands. The U.S. Army arrive at the crack of dawn.
